Dear Parents/Guardians,

I hope you are all well. A few changes are underway at the school. Mr Callaghan will be at the helm next year and will no doubt do a great job. Mrs Murphy will go on secondment for a year to work with the National Induction Programme for Newly qualified teachers.

Congratulations to the staff on the Discover Maths and Science Award. Big thank you to Ms Mc Kiernan for bringing the school through this programme. The school has successfully completed the Amber Flag Programme which promotes well-being this year. Big thank you to Ms Maguire, Ms Duffy, Mr Callaghan, Ms Folan and Mr Fahey for working on this.

We have completed our standardised testing. These scores will be sent to you via the school reports on Aladdin Connect on the 10th of June for the 6th class and on the 17th of June for the rest of the school.

Please note that standardised tests were not completed in 2020 hence for the 6th class reports you will see scores from 2nd class and 6th class. The class teacher or the Learning support teacher will contact you before sending out the report if they have a concern. Please remember the standardised tests are a moment in time and do not always reflect a child's full capability. First class have completed the Drumcondra literacy screening test so will not have a score for literacy this year. Again you will be contacted if there is a concern. We ask that you keep your child's scores private to your family. Other years children have told each other on yard what their score was and this can be upsetting for some children who may not have performed as well.
