Board of Management update:

The school has been given the go ahead to replace the flat roof on the existing building under the summer works scheme. The new building project is moving along with site surveys taking place at the moment as the design team are preparing tender documents. A review of the following policies were completed. Critical incident plan, English plan, Gaeilge plan, communication policy and elearning plan. Understanding and Living the Ethos of a Catholic school is a new programme that we will begin to work on. We have chosen target D which is "Religious Education is an integral part of the life of this school". There are still some places for junior infants 2021.Through a company called Ambisense Environmental Analytics the air quality in 4 rooms was measured for approx 5 weeks. The monitor measures CO2 levels. This in turn informs our process of ventiliation. We found if windows and doors were closed the level of CO2 rose quickly compared to when they were open. The temperature of the rooms were measured and were very cold during that cold spell in early December. With this monitor we could adjust the window and door ventilation to allow some heat to stay in the room but yet creating enough ventilation to reduce the risk of Covid. Many thanks to Ambisense Environmental Analytics. The monitoring will continue for a couple of weeks in January.

Barothery Community Council have secured new bollards for the front of the school. These will look like the other bollards in the village. There will be flower planters in between the bollards also.
