Dear parents and children,

We have all settled into the school routine again. The junior infants are enjoying the yard and this has helped them to settle into big school! Welcome to all of the new children that joined us this year. We have been lucky with the lovely weather and this has helped us all to get back into school mode. Your support is always appreciated and most so when you support your child's learning. Please continue to take the time to listen to your child read, sign their reading log, sign their homework journal and check over the homework.
