We will continue to focus on Oral language, reading fluency, spellings and handwriting. The New Primary Language Curriculum Oral English and Irish is in use in junior infants up to 2<sup>nd</sup> class. There is a leaflet attached to the newsletter to explain more about this.

In numeracy we will continue to focus on problem solving and tables with an added emphasis on the language of maths. We are looking at measurement also.

Gaeilge: We will continue our emphasis on oral lrish. This year we will focus on providing more opportunities for writing in Irish.

<u>Music:</u> We will begin the process of looking at the music curriculum as a staff this year.
