Dear parents and children,

The parent/teacher meetings were successful. A few questions were asked .It's a great opportunity to ask questions and raise concerns.

1) use of skipping ropes on the yard

Children from 1st up to 6th are allowed to skip on designated days only and in a designated area. Younger children cannot bring ropes onto yard for health and safety reasons as often they will play with the rope and not skip or they accidently hit another child while skipping. The skipping workshop was so successful that we have a huge interest in skipping. A great way to keep fit. Many thanks to Ms O Mahony who organised this workshop.

- 2) Reckless parking and driving particularly on wet mornings continues. I again would plead with people to park a safe distance away from the school even when it is raining. Keep our children safe.
- 3) Shoeboxes: It is fantastic to see how generous you have been with the shoeboxes. Comments have been made about the reward of a night off homework as this can upset children who haven't brought in a box particularly in the younger classes. This is a fair comment and we will look at it for next year. We have a tradition of supporting the shoebox collection and will look at the reward offered for next year. We collected 190 boxes. Fantastic.
